

Member Spotlight: Uma Rao, MD



Dr. Uma Rao is Professor and Vice Chair (chief) for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry in the Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior at the University of California, Irvine (UCI). She is also the Director of Education and Research in Psychiatry at the Children's Hospital of Orange County (CHOC). Additionally, she is the Director of the Biobehavioral Research on Adolescent Development (BRoAD) Lab at UCI.

Dr. Rao is highly enthusiastic to collaborate with behavioral/mental health professionals and institutions across Orange County to improve the clinical care for youth and families. She is also looking forward to work collaboratively in contributing new knowledge for the prevention and treatment of early-onset behavioral/mental health disorders, and thereby assist our youth in achieving their full potential as adults.

Dr. Rao has been involved in mood and substance use disorders research for over 25 years. Her primary areas of interest are adolescent depressive and addictive disorders, including neurobiological and psychosocial predictors of onset and longitudinal clinical course in youth with familial and/or environmental risk, developmental/ethnic influences on clinical presentation and neurobiological processes, as well as intervention research. Dr. Rao's research also includes physical/medical conditions that frequently co-occur with these disorders in which chronic stress is an influential factor, specifically obesity and pain, from a health disparities perspective. She plans to extend this work to juvenile diabetes mellitus.

Dr. Rao has received research funding from the National Institutes of Health as well as private foundations. She has published numerous research articles in scientific journals and has received awards from the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, the Indo-American Psychiatric Association and community agencies for her scientific and volunteer contributions.

Irwin (Ike) Kemper MD was a pioneer psychiatrist in Orange County. He was active in organizing psychiatric inpatient services at Hoag Hospital (1965-90) and in formation of the Orange County Psychiatric Society (originally a branch of SCPS) He also served at Fairview State Hospital and volunteered for many pro bono humanitarian programs.

Ike was a model of dedicated, compassionate care of patients and active consultation with medical colleagues. He was always available to advise and mentor psychiatrists arriving in the community.

APA Psychotherapy Caucus - An Opportunity to Raise Awareness

APA's Caucus on Psychotherapy is a special interest group that reports to the Council on Quality Care. Its diversity of theoretical orientations, demographics, and work roles are joined together by a commitment to the idea that psychiatry is (or should be) much more than psychopharmacology, and that psychotherapy is an important aspect of psychiatric identity and psychiatric skills.

Among its varied activities, the Caucus provides psychiatrists interested in

psychotherapy and psychosocial treatment a voice to communicate with the APA so that they may bring to the APA's attention important or emerging issues that affect residency training, patient care, and the practice of psychiatry with respect to psychotherapy and psychosocial treatment. It is the vision of the Psychotherapy Caucus to raise the profile of psychotherapy and psychosocial treatment in psychiatry, and to secure skills in these treatment areas as part of the training and identity of psychiatrists of the future so that the field and its practitioners are truly practicing within a biopsychosocial model.

First convening during the APA 2014 Annual Meeting in New York, the Caucus included 10 - 15 members. Caucus membership (via listserv subscribers) has since reached over 250 members and continues to grow. APA members may join the Caucus on Psychotherapy by signing into psychiatry.org, visiting the member profile, and then selecting "Psychotherapy" from the caucuses listed.
